



PUNGL: WHERE GENEROSITY MEETS JOY

Housatonic Start-Up Launches Powerful Online Fundraising Platform

Last summer, 15-year-old Zachary Goffin, a native of Great Barrington and an avid athlete and eBay shopper, attended the birthday party of a friend. Her invitation requested that partygoers not bring gifts, and Zach was intrigued. "I thought it was great that she didn't want things; she just wanted to enjoy her time with friends," he recalls.

Shortly after, at a sporting event, Zach spied some bricks outside the stadium with donors' names engraved on them, and had a lightbulb moment. "The bricks reminded me of what these people are interested in and what they find meaningful," Zach explains. "I thought there should be a place, like eBay, where you can shop for charitable gifts you can name after people, and where browsing one item might lead you to another and another."

Zach took the concept to his father, who brought on Housatonic-based creative director Abby Tovell to transform it into reality. After a year of designing and testing the new platform, getting feedback from local nonprofits, and refining the idea, Pungl was born.

Named after a word for "giving" that Zach came across while reading the Adventures of Huckleberry Finn, Pungl based in the Berkshires—is an exciting new online marketplace for the buying

and selling of unique gifts that not only celebrate a person or event, but also give back. Nonprofits can create a "shop" full of fundraising projects, then list various items available for donation, all of which can be named after the donor or gift recipient. Site users from across the country donate toward these charitable gifts to celebrate their own accomplishments or milestones, or those of a loved one. The nonprofit then names the gift in honor of the donor or recipient, leaving a lasting legacy.

This unique "double giving" model allows nonprofits, community organizations, and donors to connect with the people, places, and pursuits they love. For example, Hotfutbol, a nonprofit that runs after-school programs in Haiti, has created a spotlight project to build a new basketball court at a park in Portau-Prince. On Pungl, they have offered adjustable posts, backboards, and hoops that donors can fund to complete the project. In exchange, HotFutbol includes donors' names on the park wall, and provides photos of the wall and a personalized video as a thank-you.

Tovell says, "Pungl really can be a game changer for community-based organizations who need to raise funds, reach a broader audience, and create a broader network of partners." Pointing to Pungl's ability to connect donors and organizations across the country, no matter their size or staff resources, she notes, "Our marketplace levels the playing field for nonprofits and organizations of any size, who might not have a large staff or budget to draw from in creating fundraising campaigns, but who want to harness the combined power of their own creative thinking and our innovative technology."

Because the projects on Pungl fall into a wide range of prices, they're accessible to people of all backgrounds and budgets. This allows us all an equal opportunity to make a positive impact on the lives of others, and makes Pungl the place where generosity meets joy.
