All in a Day's Work

The Nonprofit Center fields requests for information and advice and connects nonprofits to the resources they require to grow:

Referrals: A small nonprofit needed a Human Resources consultant to help with job descriptions and policies. The NPC provided two contacts to professional HR consultants.

Connections: A cultural council needed advice on how to raise additional funds. We connected them to two other local cultural councils who excel at raising funds beyond the state allocation.

Advice: An individual wanted to start a nonprofit and was advised to become an independent contractor to nonprofits instead, so she could focus on her good work instead of fundraising and administration.

Education: Introduced a nonprofit to "Berkshire Benchmarks" web site for data she could use to support a grant application.

Inspiration: A nonprofit leader attended an NPC workshop and came away with renewed energy, practical ideas, and hope for engaging her board.

Facilitation: A large organization needed a list of nonprofits to support a grant application. We provided an up-to-date directory.

Assistance: Provided promotional help to the founders of Pungl, a new online giving platform launching in the Berkshires.

Benefits Survey

A new report, “Nonprofit Benefits in the Berkshires,” has been released by NPC in collaboration with Nash Insights of Pittsfield. A total of 40 organizations responded to the fall 2017 survey. Using this chart, see how your vacation days stack up! Additional holidays include all major Jewish holidays, Easter, and employee birthdays among others. 49% of respondents indicated that they also provide paid holidays for part-time staff.
