

EXPANDING THE NONPROFIT NARRATIVE

Depending on your point of view, we either have a scary or healthy number of nonprofits – over 1,000 in Berkshire County if you include all the churches, fire departments, teachers' unions, international aid organizations, arts and cultural organizations and civic and social groups. Each of these nonprofits has dedicated founders, volunteers and staff, and manages to forge ahead fulfilling their missions to improve life in our community despite their limited resources. Sure, the competition for funding is intense. But resources have ALWAYS been limited for nonprofits. That's practically the definition of nonprofit, and certainly the daily reality for many.

If you're a local business, you're experiencing limited resources too! It's called "donor fatigue." Requests for funding far outpace available dollars no matter how philanthropic you'd like to be. Processing the multitude of requests from many great organizations isn't easy and has probably developed into what seems like a full-time job for someone in your organization. It's hard to turn people away and it can all seem utterly unsustainable.

Nonprofits are a significant part of our economy

While corporate (and individual) donor fatigue is of real concern, it's important to continue to invest in our vital nonprofit sector. It is a huge economic engine, employing a significant chunk of our local workforce. In fact, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Berkshire

County has one of the highest rates of nonprofit employment in the U.S. And, as we've seen since the economic downturn of 2008, it's a resilient sector too. What's more, over the past decade, nonprofit job growth outpaced for-profit job growth by 3 to 1 in the U.S., as reported by Johns Hopkins Center for Civil Society Studies.

Our community has what it takes to support a large nonprofit sector

At Nonprofit Center of the Berkshires (NPC), we believe there are unleveraged assets in Berkshire County. Our mission is to connect nonprofits to those resources. Our local legislators are well aware of the vitality and importance of nonprofits and they work hard to advocate for funding. Berkshire media outlets do an admirable job covering nonprofit life and events. Local businesses are extremely generous, investing private capital to effect social change. Corporate earnings have increased under the new tax laws so corporate sponsorships and grants may even fuel nonprofit program growth. Many longtime second home owners are feeling the desire to become more involved and supportive of their Berkshire neighbors. And retirees, some of whom are choosing the Berkshires over Florida, are looking for community engagement opportunities. We are sitting on a wealth of skilled volunteers and potential donors waiting to be connected to those nonprofits that can creatively find and engage those folks.

Identifying resources

The NPC, itself a small nonprofit, supports other nonprofits by connecting them to resources such as educational workshops, consultants, publications, and networking vehicles. Founded in 2016, the NPC is a support and capacity-building organization helping nonprofits connect, learn, and grow. In our trifurcated county, with no regional government and thousands of nonprofits, this is a challenging job. With hard work, persistence and the help of many businesses that support the idea of strengthening the sector, the Nonprofit Center is making inroads in identifying more resources for nonprofits and building an infrastructure of support for this important sector of our economy.

Tapping into volunteers

The NPC has recently teamed up with Age Friendly Berkshires, Berkshire United Way and OLLI to launch a volunteer fair on November 15 at Saint James Place in Great Barrington. For each of our organizations, volunteerism is core to our mission and operations. We're excited to engage volunteers to help nonprofits, and we know that some of those volunteers will also become donors. In a newly released Independent Sector analysis, the value of an hour of a volunteer's time in Massachusetts rose 3.1% last year to \$32.15, making it the highest among the 50 states.

Making it easier to give back

We may have an extraordinary number of nonprofit organizations, but we also have a lot of people who want to help. The Nonprofit Center of the Berkshires facilitates connections between nonprofits and potential volunteers and donors through its annual *Giving Back*

guide, a free publication distributed throughout the community. The majority of organizations are small and rely heavily on individuals for a good portion of their revenue. These small nonprofits also tend to fly under the radar, so increasing awareness of their missions is key to their success.

The annual edition of *Giving Back* comes out in early November and can be found in coffee shops, banks, libraries, shops and online at npcberkshires.org. In it, individuals will find a directory of over 1,000 nonprofits by category of interest (Arts & Culture, Education, Environment, etc.), as well as full-page profiles on over 100 nonprofits. Within those profiles are descriptions of mission and program, fast facts, a list of ways to help, and contact information.

Local experts enjoy giving back

The NPC's value is in connecting nonprofits to those who can and want to help. Local experts serve as educators, guest columnists, service providers and pro bono consultants, and our community is richer for it. This work is time-consuming but critical to planning programs that steward the best use of our existing resources.

By partnering with individuals, businesses and foundations, and focusing on capacity building, skills-based volunteerism and network creation, we have built an enormous amount of human and intellectual capital. We'll harness those relationships to explore more complex solutions going forward, including resource sharing, more formal collaborations and earned income streams. Anything that strengthens nonprofit organizations helps make our community a better place for all.



OLLI: FOR THE JOY OF LEARNING

CELEBRATING 25 YEARS AT BERKSHIRE COMMUNITY COLLEGE

When Ken Stark and his wife first came to the Berkshires, they were welcomed by the community—citing cultural institutions, like Tanglewood and Berkshire Theatre Group, as captivating their attention. “I wanted to give back to show my commitment and appreciation,” says Stark whose volunteer work keeps him connected to the community. Today, after a 35-year career in the field of special education, he is one of dozens of instructors at the helm of myriad courses in the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) at Berkshire Community College—a vibrant, member-led program that provides exciting educational, social and volunteer opportunities designed especially by and for people 50 years old and up in Berkshire County.

“Our biggest challenge is finding space for our classes,” says Megan Whilden, Executive Director of OLLI—as evidenced by the more than 50 students enrolled in Stark’s “Great Conductors of Great Orchestras,” part of OLLI’s 2019 Midsummer Encore Semester. On the day I visit, Stark is painting a vivid picture of Charles Munch—noted for his mastery of the French orchestral repertoire—and his rise to fame as Music Director of the Boston Symphony Orchestra (BSO) between 1949-1962. “He wanted to be a locomotive engineer,” Stark shares from the lectern as laughter erupts, quickly adding that Munch premiered 39 new works with the BSO. “The members liked him for being more

laid back than Koussevitzky,” Stark adds, demonstrating just the tip of his iceberg-sized knowledge surrounding the topic at hand—a side passion for Stark, who holds his Masters Degree in clinical psychology.

The genesis of lifelong learning for older adults can be traced back to a group of retired professors at The New School in New York who organized a program for the simple love of learning—“and it spread like wildfire across the country and around the world,” Whilden adds. “OLLI at BCC, 25 years old this year, was begun by a group of local retirees who wanted to keep learning, teaching and having spirited discussions,” explains Whilden. Today, OLLI at BCC is one of 124 Osher Lifelong Learning Institutes spanning the country—from Maine to Hawaii—each the program of an established college or university, and each offering intellectually stimulating programming designed especially by and for seasoned adults. In 1994, Williams College was the fiscal agent for OLLI and BCC offered them free space. In the ensuing decades, the program has morphed into a program of Berkshire Community College and programs span the county—from Williamstown to Great Barrington and many locales in between.

As to the allure? “I take OLLI classes to fill my brain with great knowledge and information,” says Craig Vickers, a “snow bird” who remains an active OLLI participant when he returns to southern California. Vickers enjoyed the fresh, local

view of the BSO gleaned in Stark’s class, a key factor in what keeps many members coming back for more: the instructors’ knowledge is deep and their enthusiasm is infectious. Whilden calls OLLI a learning community, one run by its members, “where the staff simply helps bring things to fruition,” she adds. In the five years since Whilden stepped into her role, membership has increased 50%, with the current number hovering around 1,300 members. And OLLI at BCC is growing—often in creative ways. Under Whilden’s leadership, there has been increased and diversified programming. She is a self-described “yes” person; when someone comes to her with an idea, her approach is to say, “Yes! Let’s figure out how to do this.” One member came to her with the idea for a cookbook—to celebrate the 25th anniversary; Berkshire Music School also reached out with hopes of partnering to create a music program for older adults. To date, the cookbooks have been printed and 80% of OLLI members at BCC expressed interest in the prospect of the music program. “There is a great joy in learning for the sake of learning—not for the test, the grade or a promotion at work,” Whilden explains, pointing to the culture and ethos of both volunteer engagement and volunteer leadership as creating an additional draw.

Ed and Barbara Lane, OLLI’s Board President, were supporters of Berkshire Institute of Lifelong Learning (BILL), OLLI’s predecessor. Despite limitations on participation—they were living in the mid-Hudson Valley at the time—they felt it was a program worth supporting. One of the first things Barbara did upon moving to the Berkshires full time—a handful of years ago—was to look for BILL, only to find it had morphed into OLLI. After she began taking classes,

she was quickly approached about getting involved. In what Lane calls a very concentrated period of time, she has gone from being the Chair of the Membership Committee to Vice President of the Board and now President. “While we have taken one class together, we pursue our own interests,” she says of her husband who is also an active OLLI member. As to the draw for Lane? “Initially, I was interested in the content of the courses, the intellectual stimulation, but what I found—the icing on the cake—is that I met amazing, interesting, wonderful people,” she explains, citing OLLI as her primary source for developing friendships in the Berkshires.

All OLLI offerings—more than 100 each year—are open to all, regardless of age, with no prerequisites. Each semester is 4-6 weeks long and features 15-29 classes held throughout the Berkshires. Class size ranges from 5 (Reading Latin Poetry Together) to 90 (think history, current events). The ever-popular OLLI Distinguished Speakers Series runs April-October and there are special events—ranging from workshops and day trips to Art Shows and Theater Parties throughout the year. Membership, required in order to take classes, is \$60 each year.

Tuition starts at \$50 for one class; \$95 for

two or three classes; and \$125 for four or more. Partial scholarships are also available to make OLLI affordable and accessible for all. The winter semester begins January 14, 2020.

OLLI hinges on three tenets: learning, volunteerism and socialization—all of which have been shown to benefit an individual's physical and mental health, as well as improving overall quality of life. As the population of Berkshire County ages—and a push to attract young families to the area ensues—Whilden makes a salient point: We are all aging, and each of us is as old as we have ever been. Furthermore, people have a lifetime of experiences and expertise; it's important to allow them both to use it and to share it. "Retirees are big contributors, and an untapped resource, bringing knowledge, expertise, context and [their] kids [to the Berkshires]—many of whom are doing exciting things!" she emphasizes. Whilden sheds light on the fact that stereotypes about older adults are not only incorrect, but they are also harmful; in fact, research shows when an older person feels that old age is equitable with decline, they fare less well in their aging." Bit by bit, the vibrant OLLI community is helping to eradicate these negative perceptions about aging. Members create and curate the programs they attend; they make new friends; and they give back by volunteering, mentoring BCC students, and so much more. In short, OLLI is not only good for its members, but it's a valuable asset for our community.

BUILDING AN AGE-FRIENDLY BERKSHIRES. ONE STEP AT A TIME.

The Town of Lenox made a bold albeit prudent move more than 15 years ago when it placed the longstanding Council on Aging under the Parks and Recreation umbrella and moved its headquarters into the Community Center on Walker Street. In Adams, plans to convert a former elementary school into a senior center hinge on a similar thought process: if the gymnasium is left intact, young people will inevitably flock to the public space and cross paths with aging adults. Both scenarios, while seemingly unpretentious in nature, cut straight to the core of creating age-friendly communities in which everyone thrives.

Berkshire County is the second oldest county in the state of Massachusetts—trailing only behind Barnstable County which encompasses Cape Cod and is largely seen as a vacation/retirement destination. Our median age of 44 surpasses both the whole of Massachusetts (39) and the United States (36); in fact, according to the United States Census Bureau, over 50% of Berkshire County residents will be age 50 or older by 2030. This concentration of older adults led to the formation of a coalition, in 2015, called Age-Friendly Berkshires—aimed at addressing the needs of the aging Berkshire population. The movement, largely considered a collaborative effort, hinges on a simple mission: To create a more livable Berkshire County for people of all ages, with a focus on the needs of an aging population.

“The Age-Friendly Berkshires initiative is a movement to create a community that helps older adults, and even younger adults, be healthy, secure, active and engaged as they age,” explains Bobbie Orsi, of Home Instead Senior Care, and founder of Age-Friendly Berkshires. Orsi’s idea was born of a stark reality: Berkshire County is not equipped to handle the growing number of people over the age of 50 who live here. Orsi called for a coordinated approach, hence the current structure. “It’s a coalition movement, a cooperative effort,” says Peg McDonough, Coordinator for Age-Friendly Berkshires. The organization’s beginnings were voluntary, originally falling under the fiscal umbrella of Berkshires Tomorrow, Inc. which is housed at Berkshire Regional Planning Commission (BRPC) in Pittsfield. After joining the AARP Livable Communities Network in 2015, the partner organizations began a 2+ year planning phase. BRPC has since become the backbone organization for Age-Friendly Berkshires, providing staff to both support and now implement the County-wide action plan launched at the start of 2018. The big picture takes into consideration myriad systems and policies—the scope of which ranges from transportation to housing and includes the breadth of systems and services for older people in between. The coalition is comprised of activist residents, businesses, government and political leaders, nonprofit organizations and community groups across Berkshire

County with an ambitious Action Plan to create a more livable region that allows all residents to be healthy, active, safe and connected throughout their lifetimes. It’s about making the Berkshires a great place to grow up and a great place to grow old.

Successfully managing the changing needs of an aging population is a challenge magnified by our rural location. Berkshire County is the second largest in the State by area (931 square miles, lagging only behind Worcester County’s 1,513 square miles); in terms of population, it ranks 4th smallest with 126,313 residents (as of the 2017 census). This translates to a region lacking accessible transportation and housing variety; requiring longer travel time to access health and community services; and lagging in technological infrastructure that makes communication and information sharing easy. In short, it does not take a rocket scientist to see the proverbial writing on the wall: working toward a more age-friendly Berkshires will attract young people and families, too—making this a symbiotic relationship worth cultivating.

“We use any available network and means to get the word out,” says McDonough, who calls this past year “pivotal [insofar as] gaining traction in name recognition.” Citing the size and diversity of the county, there is demand for a more coordinated, cost-effective approach for product and service delivery to residents, one that keeps pace with advances in technology, health and lifestyle choices. A necessary first step is to create a communications platform, “to let people know what we are doing and trying to achieve,” explains McDonough. Strategies run the gamut, from a newly designed website and Facebook page to regular newsletters

and press releases. A 12-minute video, launched in June, highlights the work of Age-Friendly Berkshires and serves as a pivotal point of departure for individuals to get involved with the movement (visit agefriendlyberkshires.com or YouTube to view the video).

“To be an age-friendly Berkshires means a community where, regardless of your age, you have everything you need to thrive and live well,” says State Senator Adam Hinds, a champion of the movement. “Age-friendly Berkshires, to me, means finding ways to bridge the generational gaps,” is how Glenda Matos-Carter, of Northern Berkshire Community Coalition, sees it. “What can youth provide for the seniors and vice-versa?” she adds. And herein lies the catch: while older adults outnumber those under the age of 18 by a wide margin, any improvement to the quality of life for an older person benefits young people and children.

It’s what McDonough calls, “actively looking to create connections that don’t exist.” When we make sidewalks safer for seniors, moms with strollers benefit; when we build outdoor exercise spaces, with pedestrian footpaths to get there, families with young children benefit; when we provide day-glo vests to safeguard

pedestrians, drivers benefit; when we make our communities more accessible for an aging population, everyone benefits. "There's no question that when we have very deliberate intergenerational activities made available that we all are better off," says Hinds, adding "we [need to] bring that into more elements of our daily life." It's what Orsi calls an age-friendly lens, which "allow us to help people whether they are 8 years old or 80 years old," she says.

Age-Friendly Berkshires has received funding from AARP and Tufts Health Plan Foundation, and its conversations with municipalities have resulted in nine resolutions to date from officials designating their city or town as being age-friendly. "We are trying to pull it all together to demonstrate that we are making progress, building [the initiative] out," says McDonough of the 32 cities and towns in Berkshire County, each of which is doing something that is age-friendly. "The age-friendly initiative is important to everyone who lives here," says Orsi. "It's where we work, where we live, and where we play. Without a strategy to embrace that fully, and create a future that is better than the one we have, we will not see it happen in our lifetime. We have to step forward and we have to create an age-friendly community together." Which, while it might feel like a Herculean task, is in fact the antithesis. How? "One conversation at a time, one vest at a time, one good deed at a time," surmises Heather Barbieri, Emergency Management Director at Fairview Hospital.

"We have to be age-friendly," says Orsi. "We really don't have a choice. This is an ALL age-friendly effort that will benefit every Berkshire County resident for years to come."



Candace Winkler has been fine-tuning her elevator pitch as the new president and CEO of Berkshire United Way (BUW). Since taking the helm in July, she has distilled the 95-year-old organization's work down to a powerful tagline, Here for Good. As she describes it, "BUW has served South and Central Berkshire County for close to a century and we are not going anywhere. We are committed to improving the lives of people working and raising families right here – from Dalton to Pittsfield to Great Barrington. We bring donors, nonprofits and volunteers together to solve problems and do good." Simply put: Together, we do more.

Supporters of BUW not only help fund local nonprofits working on critical issues, but they also support the data collection and coordination of services that lead to improved individual circumstances and elevated quality of life here in Berkshire County. BUW's work hinges on a clear vision: ensuring this county is a dynamic, engaged community that provides opportunities for all. "We leverage gifts from lots of different individuals," says Winkler, ranging from donors in the workplace to individuals who want to invest in the community. As to the results? "We are able to magnify those gifts in ways that make a real difference in people's lives," she explains. A wider lens on what the community needs, coupled with substantial data, allows BUW "to make strategic investments that help solve community problems."

BUW has a track record of success. In 2010, the organization identified teen pregnancy as an imminent and growing problem and launched the Face the Facts coalition to tackle the issue. BUW developed shared data points, community goals, hosted a multitude of community conversations and funded dozens of local nonprofits to implement a county-wide campaign and on-the-ground mentoring and intervention services. Within seven years, this collaborative approach had worked, reducing the teen pregnancy rate by 50%. Winkler's commitment to this collaborative, data-driven approach is interconnected with BUW's three community goals: children are ready for school, teens are prepared for college or career, and our neighbors are earning a living wage that enables them to support their families.

By having a finger on the pulse of the community, BUW has provided significant support and funding to programs that focus on early childhood education and positive youth outcomes. Three funded programs – the Hello It's Me Project led by Dr. Claudia Gold; the Expressive Arts Program at Lee Elementary School led by Principal Kate Retzel; and Project Connection at Monument Valley Regional Middle School led by 21st Century Coordinator Thomas Kelly and Will Conklin of Greenagers – exhibit both the scope and interconnectedness of BUW's partners in action.

Gold has made a career of thinking — in

a big way — about how to raise healthy children. A pediatrician turned children's mental health care specialist, she is the director of the Hello It's Me Project, a community-based initiative to promote healthy parent-infant relationships from birth. "To get things going in a healthy way from the very beginning is not the end of the story," says Gold, whose primary aim is to empower new parents by shining a spotlight on the tremendous capacity for connection babies have when they enter the world. The project, which debuted in Pittsfield last spring, not only brings together a wide variety of partners committed to protecting and nurturing these tender new relationships, but is also a key component to BUW's mission to ensure every child arrives at kindergarten ready to learn and is on a path to school success.

A cornerstone of Gold's project — now a funded partner of BUW — is the Newborn Behavioral Observations (NBO) system, a relationship-building tool that draws on the work of renowned pediatrician T. Berry Brazelton. Annual two-day trainings (the next is slated for April 2020) bring together a spectrum of individuals – from pediatricians and

maternity nurses to early intervention specialists and lactation consultants – and call attention to the need to support early relationships through referral connections among programs. The next level will be to implement the NBO for newborns and their families at Berkshire Medical Center.

Retzel's work to create a trauma-informed school in Lee came out of multifaceted community conversations initiated by BUW's Chapter One early childhood initiative in South County. "We began to see how one part of the community is affected by all others," Retzel explains. This interconnectivity fueled her belief she had a wider context in which to work and "that gave me the confidence to change the culture at our school with the vision of trauma sensitive/heart-centered care for all individuals in the community." Her work with Chapter One has allowed her to network with individuals across different sectors to help support the birth to age 5 population – all of which feeds her elementary school and affects her families directly.

This year, Lee Elementary School has partnered with BUW to pilot a trauma-informed Expressive Arts (EA) program for grades K-1 aimed at enhancing protective factors of children at high risk of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE). The Trauma and Learning Policy Institute estimates that 16% of children in Massachusetts will experience one or more ACE; at Lee Elementary, a startling 22-39% of students are at serious risk of ACEs. The pilot program addresses this elevated risk through an intentional, research-based intervention that provides a safe and nurturing space for at-risk children to explore the arts with a trained, trauma-informed teacher.

“The support from BUW is valuable to Project Connection/Berkshire Hills Regional School District in many ways,” says Tom Kelly, program director. The year-round program funded by BUW provides support for high-need students and their families. Recent funding from BUW has been instrumental in supporting collaborative work with Greenagers to connect seventh- and eighth-grade students to their community. “They are discovering challenges and making a real impact through service-learning projects,” explains Kelly.

Greenagers introduces students to local individuals and organizations who work to preserve our local environment and create a culture of climate-friendly and sustainable practices in our community. Students get to see what working on a Greenagers Trail Crew entails and learn about employment opportunities. When middle schoolers make connections with community members and work directly to address real-world challenges, change happens. Funding also ensures safe and reliable transportation is provided for students to various farms and trails throughout the region.

“BUW helps align and leverage the resources of Project Connection and many other local organizations who have a common mission to strengthen our community through positive youth development,” Kelly explains, citing the timing as critical. Students will synthesize skills to succeed as they progress to high school and begin to develop goals and plans for post-secondary experiences.

Winkler, her board and staff continue to look at ways to get more resources out into the community — “where the rubber meets the road.” Each of the 34 youth programs BUW funds is paving

a successful pathway for local children, from birth through adolescence. “Through our work we have realized you can’t just support kids, you have to support the whole family. When parents have the resources they need to be successful, children do better. We live here, work here, and play here and as a community partner, BUW is Here For Good,” explains Winkler. It’s that simple.

To provide compassionate health care, supportive services and education in Western MA, especially to those who otherwise might not receive care. We believe that everyone deserves access to high-quality health care in a supportive environment without fear of judgment or stigma.

PROGRAMS & OFFERINGS

In the Berkshires, Tapestry provides Sexual & Reproductive Health Care and Harm Reduction (syringe service programs, overdose prevention, Narcan access and training and risk reduction counseling). When clients come to us, they pay based on what they can afford, and no one is ever turned away. Our Sexual & Reproductive Health clinics, in Pittsfield and North Adams, are the only Berkshire providers offering fully confidential, sliding-scale health services like breast exams, cervical cancer screenings, birth control, and testing and treatment for STIs and HIV. Tapestry’s Harm Reduction site in North Adams, and Tapestry’s outreach services, provide effective community health interventions to prevent the spread of HIV, and to reduce overdose deaths. We provide services in a caring, non judgmental manner, so everyone has a safe place to turn in difficult circumstances.

Tapestry has locations in all four counties of Western MA, providing Sexual & Reproductive Health, Harm Reduction and WIC Family Nutrition services.
