The Nonprofit Center of the Berkshires (NPC) was founded in 2016 to connect nonprofits to resources they need to thrive including educational workshops, pro bono consultants, networking opportunities, and volunteers.

The NPC promotes volunteerism as a way to bolster the capacity of nonprofits. In an area rich with retirees and second homeowners looking for ways to engage with the community, efforts to coordinate volunteerism really pay off for all involved.

The **Giving Back guide** is the ultimate resource for connecting volunteers and donors to nonprofits. It contains a directory of over 1,000 Berkshire nonprofits as well as nonprofit profiles that describe ways people can help. Advertisers include businesses and consultants who embrace the concept of giving back to one's community.

Volunteer Fairs connect nonprofits face-to-face with volunteer prospects. Plans to expand fairs throughout the county are currently on

hold due to the pandemic but a new web site, **GiveBackBerkshires.org**, is providing another way to connect and get information about volunteer opportunities.

Board Trainings provide critical information to those who would like to serve but have little to no prior experience in nonprofit governance. Topics include financial and legal roles and responsibilities, fundraising, committee structure and more.

Presentations about the nonprofit sector and how to get involved are given to leadership program cohorts, students, and organizations wanting to increase volunteerism within their ranks.

We are lucky to live in a place where so many share our values. Thanks to our local business and foundation supporters, we are able to focus on what we do best – connecting nonprofits to people who want to help.

For the first time since our communities were told to shelter in place due to the COVID-19 pandemic, I had the thrill of stepping into a museum. In the Berkshires, we have supported hundreds of volunteers at MLK Day and National Volunteer Week service projects and through the Youth Development Volunteer Initiative grants and AmeriCorps and Commonwealth Corps members dedicating a year of their lives to helping care for Berkshire communities.

Today, with the nation in crisis as we attempt to slow the spread of COVID-19, the importance of helping our neighbors has never been clearer as volunteers across the Commonwealth band together to help the most vulnerable among us. When the

pandemic struck, many of our AmeriCorps and Commonwealth Corps members and volunteers shifted from their normal service to meet immediate needs in their communities. Members made phone calls to older residents, provided virtual support in academic, workforce, and college readiness, addressed food insecurity, and produced and distributed masks. MSA shifted to providing workshops and trainings

virtually in order to make sure that nonprofits have the tools they need to engage volunteers and corps members effectively during this crisis.

And as we look forward to a time when all volunteer programming across the Commonwealth can get back to normal, MSA is here to make sure volunteers and corps members continue to be an integral part of the Berkshires' future.

Volunteers contribute \$187.7 billion to the United States through their time, talent, and effort

Independent Sector and the Do Good Institute recently announced that the latest value of a volunteer hour is \$27.20 – up 7% from the previous year. Massachusetts ranks third in the nation with a value of \$32.96. "We know intuitively and through the Value of Volunteer Time that volunteers' selfless work is a valuable asset that enables nonprofits to extend even further critical services they provide in communities nationwide," said Independent Sector president and CEO Dan Cardinali. "But during this extraordinary time of challenge caused by COVID-19, when many organizations are struggling economically to maintain mission-critical operations, the contributions of volunteers are more important than ever, and often a critical linchpin that enables nonprofit organizations to continue to provide needed services to help communities endure and survive the pandemic." "Volunteering not only helps nonprofit organizations better support the people and communities they serve around the country, but also promotes civic participation, helping to strengthen the ties that bind communities together," said Robert T. Grimm, Jr., director of the Do Good Institute. "Our nation is full of people whose time and talents make a positive difference in the lives of so many individuals, and the data just proves even further what a valuable asset volunteers are in building stronger and more equitable communities."



MISSION

Baseball in the Berkshires’ mission is to present exhibits and educational programs that will assist in telling the story of baseball in the Berkshires. Baseball is truly America’s Game and here in the Berkshires baseball has some roots and some very strong branches. Frank Grant and Jack Chesbro are our Hall of Famers, but they are not our only Berkshire Diamonds. From the Broken Window by-law of 1791 to the first collegiate game in 1859 between Amherst and Williams, from the teams: the Old Elms, the Pittsfields, Hillies, Electrics and all of the farm and minor league teams that have called the Berkshires their home all just add to the long and colorful history of baseball in the Berkshires.

PROGRAMS & OFFERINGS

Baseball in the Berkshires delivers programming that highlights the cultural and historical part of Baseball in the Berkshires and at the same time offering educational programming to all age groups. Our education curriculum “Sliding Baseball Across the Curriculum” incorporates Math, Science, History, Economics, Civil Rights, Cultural Diversity, Visual Arts, Communication Arts, Special Abilities, Women’s History, Music, Physics, Technology, Art, Geography, Language Arts and Character Education using baseball as the vehicle for education. This curriculum is based on the National Baseball Hall of Fame Curriculum “Baseball in the Classroom” and is written to the Core Curriculum Standards. Our school programs are literature based re-emphasizing the importance of reading.

BerkShares, Inc. is a place-based, democratically structured non-profit organization that works in collaboration with participating local banks, businesses, and non-profits to strengthen the Berkshire regional economy through a local currency program and related pursuits.

PROGRAMS & OFFERINGS

BerkShares, Inc. issues BerkShares, a local currency for the Berkshire region of Massachusetts. Federal currency is exchanged for BerkShares at nine participating branch offices of three local banks and spent at locally owned participating businesses. The circulation of BerkShares encourages capital to remain within the region, building a greater affinity between the local business community and its citizens. BerkShares serve as a tool for community economic empowerment and development toward regional self-reliance. In addition to the currency, BerkShares, Inc. hosts Entry to Entrepreneurship, a business planning program taught by local business professionals with a special focus on the local economy.



To facilitate the well-being of ALL new Berkshire County families we: 1) raise awareness of safe sleep issues and furnish a safe sleeping space for newborns; 2) provide needed items to help ease the transition to new parenthood; 3) facilitate connections for new families to local resources, parenting education, guidance and support.

PROGRAMS & OFFERINGS

Berkshire Baby Box provides the Finnish style "Baby Shower in a Box" to all expectant families in the Berkshires. The Box serves as a safe sleeping space for infants up to 6 months old. Box distribution is tied to an educational program with the goal of providing information as well as creating community. This recognizes that new parenthood is a challenging and often isolating time for all. Boxes are given out at agencies throughout the county. Over 1,000 Baby Boxes were given out in our first 4 years, and we plan to have Baby Boxes become an anticipated rite of passage for all Berkshire families.

BBG's 24 acres of display gardens provide an outdoor classroom for those wishing to expand their knowledge of horticulture and garden design. Year-round online and onsite workshops, classes, and lectures provide educational opportunities for beginner to advanced gardeners; professional development programs are offered through the Garden's popular Horticulture Certificate Program. The newly renovated Center House with its teaching kitchen, three galleries, botanical library, and classroom/ meeting space provides a beautiful setting for classes and events. MISSION

Berkshire Bounty is a food rescue operation, and has created a broad community of food donors, food distribution organizations and volunteers to create a flow of nutritious food from food sources to those people in the Berkshires who are experiencing food insecurity.

PROGRAMS & OFFERINGS

Berkshire Bounty collects excess fresh produce, meat and baked goods from supermarkets, farms, farmers markets and property owners with trees, and delivers that food to pantries, senior centers and other distribution organizations for use by those people experiencing food insecurity in South County and Pittsfield. Through the generosity of our food donors, our growth has been explosive: we collected 8,000 pounds in 2017, 33,000 pounds in 2018, 130,000 pounds in 2019, and expect to collect over 200,000 pounds in 2020. Berkshire Bounty has identified further growth opportunities that can be realized as we attract more volunteers.

Our unique leases allow lessees to build equity while upholding community goals of diversity, sustainability and reduction of speculation. We hold and lease 49 acres of community-owned land to Indian Line Farm, the Schumacher Center for a New Economics, Life Needs Co-op, and 21 homes at Forest Row (Great Barrington) and Alvastra (Egremont). 12 Safer Ways to Volunteer Today

During the pandemic, we've heard many people say they feel less connected -- but are still interested in helping others. We've especially heard this feedback from many of our volunteers aged 55+, who are navigating a wide range of stressors, from caring for their own health, to taking care of families and grandkids, while also experiencing higher than average unemployment rates.

Your help is needed now more than ever when it comes to volunteering in-person, as some volunteering can't be done virtually. The demand for in-person volunteering keeps growing as the needs in our communities increase and fewer large groups are able to volunteer in person. Many of our nonprofits in the U.S. have reworked and innovated their in-person opportunities to ensure they follow the CDC guidelines.

There has, naturally, also been a large shift to virtual opportunities. On VolunteerMatch, we have over 1.1 million virtual volunteers needed, and over 760,000 roles have been earmarked by our nonprofits as "great for 55+". In a survey we performed this May, 45% of nonprofits are now offering more virtual opportunities—up from 32% in March. With so many opportunities, both in-person and virtual, you are sure to find something that aligns with a cause that you are passionate about and that meets your needs for safer volunteering.

Here are 12 ways to give back that offer safe distancing or other CDC-guideline-ground volunteer opportunities:

1. Start a food drive in your neighborhood, and consider inviting friends and colleagues to participate virtually or using safe distancing. Neighbors can drop off the food outside of your house, and you can make arrangements to have a nonprofit pick up the food or have them grab the food straight from your car.
2. Sew cloth face coverings. Online virtual sewing circles are a great way to socialize, refresh existing friendships, and meet new friends using free video conferencing tools like Zoom. We've heard of teams meeting on a range of frequencies that work best for them, be it weekly, biweekly, or monthly.
3. Tutor a child or be a mentor. We all know that seeing a child learn and grow is so rewarding. What you may not know is that mentoring programs are some of the hardest hit offerings across our country in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic. And many parents don't have extended families

to help them teach and nurture their child's growth and development -- which will only be tougher with many schools going entirely online. Consider lending a hand and being a mentor or tutor to a young person today!

4. Start a clothing drive. While many organizations are still not accepting donations of household goods, others have reopened this important channel. As we spend more time at home, we're all becoming acquainted with something mental health professionals have known for a long time: clutter-free spaces are good for our wellbeing!

5. Make quilts or knit something cozy for people in your community. Then, share your beautiful quilt or throw on social media and challenge your friends to contribute a square the next time. BONUS: If knitting is a new hobby for you, it can improve your memory!

6. Donate money or host a fundraiser to draw awareness and encourage gifting to the causes you are most passionate about. Many nonprofits are being challenged financially, so giving any amount you can will help to support our communities. Did you know that at VolunteerMatch, through our partnership with Network for Good, you can make gifts to the causes you care about? Just click Donate, and it will take you to a donation page, like this one for network member Soldiers' Angels. As a nonprofit ourselves, VolunteerMatch is also grateful to have our own Network for Good campaign page -- every dollar counts!

7. Lend a hand at your local food bank. You can volunteer safely by following the CDC guidelines. Here's a recent study of the most effective masks. Many food

banks are distributing food via low contact methods like drive-thru distribution where people wear masks and gloves as they load cars with food. Some food banks are also offering home delivery. And they follow CDC guidelines by limiting the number of volunteers in each room when filling boxes. You'll be playing a key role in helping the growing number of people in need of additional food support during COVID-19.

8. Lend a sympathetic ear. Given the additional pressures of the ongoing worry about the pandemic and its impacts which are disproportionately hitting BIPOC communities, many people are having an even more difficult time than usual. Become a virtual volunteer to help promote mental well-being and prevent suicide.

9. Build care packages. Invite your friends, neighbors or co-workers to contribute!

10. Write. If you enjoy writing, why not use your skills to support the many nonprofits that need it?

11. Support active military, veterans and their families. There are so many ways for you to show your appreciation for military, veterans, and their families, and add some ease and happiness to their lives.

12. Foster a dog, cat or other pet in need. You may have more time on your hands these days and could benefit from the companionship from a furry friend. By fostering an animal, you will not only be providing a loving home, you will also bring some joy into your life, and even improve your health.

Volunteering: A Formula For Help And Happiness

Volunteers are in the news for actively working in communities hard-hit by natural disasters and political unrest. We have seen so many amazing examples of the impact that volunteers can make, and it's worth learning more about what that impact looks like for ourselves and in our communities.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics tells us that a quarter of Americans volunteered through an organization in 2015, the last time BLS conducted a comprehensive study. In the Dallas-Fort Worth market, where I live, we have a slightly higher volunteerism rate at 27.5%. The American city with the highest volunteer rate is Minneapolis at 37.1% and the lowest is Miami/Fort Lauderdale at 13.4%. (You can see more stats at nationalservice.gov/serve/via.)

So why should we care? There are a couple of important reasons. First, there are not enough paid staff to address all the needs of our communities. Second, the well-being of people is positively impacted when they volunteer. In other words, we all win. It's as simple as that.

What does the organization get? It runs! It can accomplish its mission. It has the people it needs to do the necessary work and provide its services to those who could not otherwise access them. According to the National Council of Nonprofits, many organizations run with no paid staff at all, which makes volunteers essential to their mission.

As volunteers, what do we get out of it? I began to think more about this after organizing a volunteer day at a local food pantry for my Toastmasters group several years ago. There were three leadership skills that stood out to me after this experience. The first is flexibility, a skill that serves volunteers and leaders well. When you volunteer, the supplies, the number of people who are there to help out and the funding can all change rapidly, though the mission remains the same. The second leadership skill that shows up in volunteering is problem-solving. I found in an

elementary school where I volunteered required a lot of problem-solving just to be able to help the kids with math that didn't look like any math I learned at their age. Finally, our ability to take initiative grows when we volunteer. Seeing what is needed in the moment and acting on that need is essential as a volunteer and as a leader.

Additionally, there is research that suggests volunteering is good for us in other ways. In a paper published by Harvard Health, authors noted that volunteers benefit from something they call the "happiness effect." It turns out that weekly volunteering leads to happiness levels comparable to a life-changing salary boost.

This same Harvard Health paper also points out that, ultimately, volunteering helps the community. When people work together in a volunteer capacity they begin to build social connections based on shared values, all of which work in favor of a stronger, more connected community. And the actual work done by volunteers is often directly related to the health of the people, animals and organizations in the community. This improves the positive environment for all.

With so many benefits resulting from volunteering, the obvious question is, "Why don't more people engage in volunteerism?" PTO Today suggests that it is, at least in part, because the volunteer opportunity does not speak to what they value. "Giving back" may not be meaningful to someone. But, meeting new people or getting to hang out in the art museum every Saturday may offer a valuable enough experience to entice participation. Linking volunteer opportunities to what you value is a great motivator. So is the mere act of asking someone to join you at your favorite nonprofit.

A common reason people give for not volunteering is lack of time. While this is a real issue, many times it can be overcome. As I mentioned earlier, people volunteer for personal reasons and often "I don't have time" may be a euphemism for "I don't know what I can do" or "Nobody has asked." Some of the responsibility for clarity and connection lies with the nonprofit and some with the would-be volunteer. Nonprofits are beginning to revise expectations for volunteers to reduce complexity and time required for service.

Individuals may want to start by leveraging time you already spend with loved ones. Out for a bike ride or walk with your family? Take bags and pick up trash along the route. Or you may want to take a Saturday afternoon to visit a nursing home or plant flowers in a community garden as a group. Great family time is not the only benefit of this approach. Data suggests children learn critical life skills and are less likely to engage in at-risk behaviors when they volunteer at a young age.

Volunteering is the right thing to do for so many reasons: for your community, for your health, for your leadership development. Search online or in your community for service opportunities that suit your schedule and values. In spite of the stress of life and the lack of time — or maybe because of it — get out there and volunteer. Do good, feel happier, build relationships, learn new skills and have an impact on something important to you.
