Berkshire Bounty also uses the proceeds of grants and financial donations to purchase food for delivery to the same network of distribution organizations. Through the generosity of our food and financial donors, our growth has been explosive, having collected and delivered 8,000, 33,000, 130,000, and 270,000 pounds of food in 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 respectively. We are on track to deliver in excess of 450,000 pounds in 2021. We expect continued growth as we identify new opportunities to serve the community.

Media Collaborative Berkshire Film and Media Collaborative creates educational, workforce and production opportunities in the film and media industry as an economic initiative for the Berkshire region of western Massachusetts.

# **PROGRAMS & OFFERINGS**

BFMC develops educational and workforce enrichment courses, offers networking events for industry professionals, acts as a resource for productions shooting locally, generates revenue for local businesses, creates jobs for our community in the film industry, and provides an online production guide and locations database resource for filmmakers. Our Youth Film Challenge runs until late 2021 and is an opportunity for young people in our region, ages 14-24, to make videos about subjects that are important to them (climate change, immigration, diversity, inclusion and representation to name a few). Our Community Film Fund is a matching fund (up to \$5,000) for our smaller nonprofits to make impactful videos for their branding, marketing and social media. We are conducting a feasibility study to build an international film and education center, Kemble Street Studios (KSS), on the grounds of Shakespeare & Company. KSS will be a full service production and post production facility dedicated to teaching the craft of filmmaking and responsible media messaging. KSS will be a place for our young people to learn this growing industry and for local organizations to create quality videos.

As women co-create community together they step with greater confidence and tenacity toward advancing their personal initiatives as well as those that powerfully impact the greater community for the better.


