All Hands on Deck

Newcomers to the Berkshires Find Community and Joy in Volunteering

Upon Dan Levinson's recent relocation to South Egremont, pitching in at Blue Rider Stables was a no brainer. Unbridled enthusiasm coupled with a deep empathy for equines quickly led to his harnessing a cogent connection to the local community, one that has rendered Levinson's (re) adjustment to the region akin to a mare's graceful canter.

"I grew up in the '60s, marching on everything," said Levinson, who earned degrees from Brown and Stanford before going into business. After raising three children (in Westport, Conn.), Levinson had a realization: "My kids don't know what I do; they don't know what's in my heart." He quickly set to work doing something meaningful — as evidenced by an intentional shift to community nonprofit work. In the ensuing decade, he's fully employed all his for-profit skills (including contacts

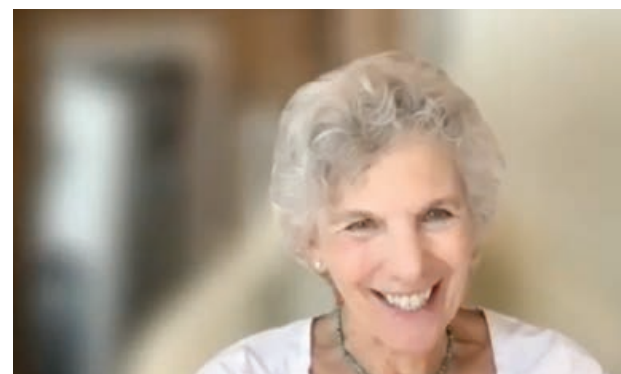
and accumulated wealth) and put them toward a novel daily mantra: *How can I do good today?*

Which is precisely how he found his way to the barn at Blue Rider — a nonprofit offering mutual therapeutic equine experiences in a holistic educational environment — where Levinson lavishes spa treatments upon a 27-year-old retired barrel racer named Oskar. "Finding my way around [the stable] is a project, but it's been tremendously rewarding and I love it," said Levinson of his daily practice — a hands-on means of giving back that never quite fit into busy days spent running a business and raising a family.

"If you have someone with a strong background, even if they're mucking [stalls] and grooming [horses], they're generally thinking about how to improve the situation in a bigger way," said Levinson, peeling back another layer that informs his perspective which inevitably includes the big picture — as evidenced by his many years chairing The Schumacher Center for a New Economics.

When Levinson relocated to the 413 (having spent summers on Stockbridge Bowl where his family had a home for four decades), he did not ask for directions to the gym or the liquor store; instead, Levinson set out to put his finger on the proverbial pulse of the nonprofit space — which is how he met Liana Toscanini of the NPC Berkshires, someone he heard was doing critical work.

"I like to go to the places that need me," Levinson says, underscoring advice his mother once gave him (albeit about the importance of being discerning with one's dollars). At the barn, Oskar's headaches and visual problems — lingering symptoms of having been accidentally kicked in the head by another horse more than two years ago — seem less of a burden after time with Levinson, who administers red light-therapy and provides a safe space for a gelding who has given so much of himself to humans over the years.

Tangible evidence that her efforts are helping others is part of what tethers Julie Koppenheffer to the Berkshires. She spent the 1970s living in Williamstown, where she practiced law by day and engaged with various nonprofits — from the local housing authority to the local land trust — in her free time. Koppenheffer ultimately participated in a Masters in Leadership Program, designed to position those with successful careers to give back to the community.

"It took a while to find something appropriate to my skills, where I thought I could make a contribution," Koppenheffer said, confident that the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute's, "Changing the Culture of Ageism SIG" was the appropriate arena. Over the past year, her podcast *Living Well Into The Future* (broadcast live on WTBR 89.7) has not only created a dialogue



between different generations but is also charting a path forward.

“There’s a continuum of people addressing long-standing issues from food insecurity to affordable housing,” Koppenheffer said, the latter harkening back to her own early volunteer interests. In addition to identifying “all the good work going on here,” she is keen on creating conversation among individuals who share interests in vital issues — from food and climate to housing and health — which not only stand to stimulate discussion but also move individuals to action and effect change.

“Finding groups of common interests is the key to integration,” Koppenheffer says, citing myriad organizations in the region where those who share passions — from the greeters and docents at Tanglewood (where she spent several seasons) to volunteers at food pantries — have at their fingertips dozens of ways, “to enter, participate and contribute” to the rich fabric of life in the Berkshires.

Katherine Grubbs relocated to the region in late August 2020. While she’s been with the Committee for Public Counsel Services since 2006, taking the role of Attorney in Charge required a move to the Berkshires — smack dab in the middle of the pandemic.

“There’s a wide variety of wraparound needs our clients have,” Grubbs said, citing help with housing, immigration concerns, and treatment

issues topping the list. Moving to a new community, she did not have any of those connections in place — for herself or her clients.

Grubbs cites her main goal as existing at the intersection of her employer’s mission and a personal belief: “I wanted to meet people [specifically those] whose work dovetailed with our work at the CPCS in ways that benefit our clients and the community,” she says, adding that being “new in town” afforded her the freedom to reach out and engage in meaningful conversation about collaboration.

“Getting to know the community, and helping our clients feel at home here,” is Grubbs’ way of underscoring that her work is not just about what happens in criminal court. She began by reaching out to organizations whose clientele overlapped with hers. Grubbs’ office worked with the District Attorney’s

Community Outreach office to organize a Women in Law Career Pathways forum with BCC in March 2021; she has led several workshops, in conjunction with Community Legal Aid, aimed at teaching individuals how to expunge their records; she collaborated with the Berkshire Immigrant Center on a “know your rights” series of events and in April, Grubbs worked with the Berkshire County House of Corrections and the Pittsfield City Jazz Festival to solicit artwork from inmates as a means of both “recognizing and reminding the community that people who have criminal records or are incarcerated are very much a part of the [local] community.” Continued connections, thanks to what Grubbs calls “a branching out approach”, have undoubtedly served her well as she settles into life in the 413.

This past spring, Grubbs was invited to sit on the board of directors for Second Street Second Chances (a one-stop facility to aid Pittsfield residents who have been incarcerated reentering the community, located at the former Second Street correctional facility). She points to serving on boards as an “opportunity to have a very clear voice in supporting and shaping the mission of an organization that you believe in,” despite being a (relatively) unknown quantity prior to her appointment.

For Grubbs, volunteering has given her a much more complete understanding of Berkshire County (and the unique pockets that span its 946 square miles!), the people who live here, and their passions. It’s a connection she shares with Levinson who currently sits at the helm of Main Street Resources — a private equity firm partnering with entrepreneurs in growing smaller New England businesses.

As to what energizes him? “Finding people I love and asking how I can help,” says Levinson, whose niche is finding good people doing important local work that can be meaningfully advanced with the right involvement. Levinson feels the term volunteer misses the mark for many and instead seeks game changers and social enterprise venture partners for community service and engagement — terms he’s confident will resonate with the breadth of talented individuals who have come to congregate in Berkshire County.

“There’s a lot of wealth moving to [the Berkshires], and a lot of capacity,” said Levinson, underscoring the need to activate these resources deemed invaluable to nonprofits. It’s a sentiment with which Grubbs concurs.

“Although in some ways, moving anywhere — as an outsider — is challenging, I think that volunteering and collaborating with organizations with whom you share interests (from gardening and jazz music to Constitutional rights) is a way to establish community...that reaches people who have different interests ... in a very real way.”

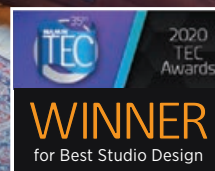



Nonprofit 411: How Inclusionary Practices Can Empower Traditionally Underrepresented Investors to Save More for Retirement

A survey conducted by The Harris Poll on behalf of Empower Retirement reveals that many employees experience a sense of disconnection from the retirement and financial services industries. In the short term, this disconnection can cause confusion about how best to plan for the future, and in the long term it can result in a less secure retirement.

Our results also show that traditionally underrepresented groups are behind when it comes to retirement preparation. In other words, not only are there perceived inequities across demographics, but there are also realized retirement inequities.

One reason for this retirement inequality is that a higher percentage of traditionally unrepresented groups do not have access to workplace retirement plans. Having that access increases the likelihood that an employee has begun saving. In addition, traditionally underrepresented employees tend to lag their counterparts when it comes to their income levels. It stands to reason that this disparity may impact the ability of lower-income employees to save for retirement.

Investors who have been traditionally underrepresented recognize the need for more financial education and guidance, but many are uncertain where to turn for unbiased advice. Many employees who are not white men say they will not be taken seriously as a client by a financial services company.

Perhaps as a result, many of these employees are turning to family, friends and colleagues for financial advice instead of financial advisors. This leaves a large percentage of Americans relying on sources that are not necessarily trained for providing retirement savings guidance.

To help people of all demographics save effectively for retirement, employers and financial services providers should constantly evaluate and re-evaluate communications, retirement plan offerings and employee outcomes, then make adjustments as needed. This effort starts with understanding the current reality of employee attitudes and outcomes.

According to the Harris Poll survey, the top 5 ways respondents want to learn about retirement are:

1. Online tools I can use to fit my needs/situation
2. Easy-to-read articles on websites
3. Personalized information about my savings
4. Classes I can view online to educate myself
5. Visual information

Tackling the retirement wealth gap starts with communicating to employees clearly and straightforwardly about their retirement saving opportunities. Employers and advisors who can take the time to understand investors' needs are more likely to connect with them. Additionally, financial services providers should make sure all employees have access to unbiased retirement advice and increase participation throughout the organization, so the population of retirement savers better reflects the makeup of society. Over time, such efforts can help close the retirement wealth gap.

This program allows the participating markets to match SNAP dollars, \$1-for-\$1, so low-income families can more easily afford fresh, local food, all while increasing sales for farmers.

The quiet difference she made: Tribute to philanthropist Suzanne Green

You might not be familiar with the name Suzanne Green, but if you live in south or central Berkshire County, you or a loved one, including those of the canine or feline variety, have likely been a direct or indirect beneficiary of her generosity over the past two decades. Suzanne died of organ failure on July 23 at Berkshire Medical Center at the age of 56. She did not technically leave heirs, but local nonprofit leaders agree that it would be no exaggeration to claim that the lives of thousands of local children, teens, and adults are the inheritors of her quiet, careful, unusual style of generosity.

Suzanne spent the bulk of her time—when not renovating her big old New Marlborough farmhouse, or caring for her beloved pets, or checking in with her many friends—as an exceptionally hands-on board member of the Los Angeles-based Green Foundation, which focuses on supporting community services, education, and the arts. Her father, Leonard I. Green, made his fortune in the leveraged buyout industry, and once served as President of the Board of the Los Angeles Opera. He created the foundation in the late 1990's, and the vast majority of the roughly 250 nonprofits the foundation supported each year, to the tune of nearly eight million dollars in grants, were located in and around Los Angeles County. But over the twenty or so years that Suzanne made her home here, she quietly and steadily built up a Berkshire County and Columbia County portfolio of grantees, zeroing in on those who work to meet some of our area's most pressing needs.

Until this past April, Kylie Wright was the key staff member for the Green Foundation for seventeen years, serving most recently as Vice President of Grants. Even after leaving her post to join the Rose Hills Foundation as the Vice President of Grants and Initiatives, she continued to stay in close contact with Suzanne. She's quick to credit her for her extensive research in, and sustained advocacy for, local causes. "She brought the Berkshire grantees to our attention. She let us know about Railroad Street Youth Project, Barrington Stage Company, CATA, all of these organizations that we wouldn't have known anything about." (A further—if partial—list the other local entities that the Green Foundation has supported through the years include Volunteers in Medicine, Flying Deer Nature Center, Berkshire Hills Regional School District, AnimalKind in Hudson, and Greenagers.)

Many donors seem to be motivated primarily by the chance to put their name on a building or event and to enhance their social standing. Suzanne wanted none of that. She heard a story about suffering, and asked how she could help to alleviate it. Volunteers in Medicine (VIM), has offered medical, dental, and behavioral health care to the region's uninsured population since its creation in 2003. Dr. Ilana Steinhauer joined as Executive Director in 2014, at which point a well-established relationship with the Green Foundation was already in place. She was struck by Suzanne's commitment to the Berkshires, her humility, and her single-minded focus on the work. "She understood the mission," says Steinhauer, "and never said, 'This is how I think it should be done.' She listened and engaged and advocated. She knew us so intimately that she could go out in the world and speak about us. Her support was life-changing, but also life-saving. We're talking about thousands of people."

Another quality that set Suzanne apart was her interest in expanding the Green Foundation's reach. She saw giving as the opposite of a zero-sum game. One grant invariably led to, rather than replaced, another. "She would ask about other organizations we worked with," recalled Steinhauer, "so that she could continue to keep learning about what to support."

This proactive approach had always been her way. Back in the early 2000s, Suzanne was just visiting the area, and an article in the Litchfield County Times featured an antique store owner named Vivian Kimmelman, who spoke in the piece about her volunteer work with Hudson-based organization AnimalKind. "Shortly after the article came out, I got a call from Suzanne and she said, 'I don't usually do this, but I read about you and your work with the animal organization.'" So began a long friendship between the two women, and an enduring legacy of support from the Green Foundation for AnimalKind.

If, for whatever reason, foundation support was not forthcoming, Suzanne was known to write checks herself, unsolicited, with no expectation of acknowledgement. Liana Toscanini, of the Nonprofit Center of the Berkshires, found that the center didn't fit into Green Foundation program area priorities, so Suzanne sent her a generous gift of her own. I had a similar experience. In 2011, I created the Crocus Fund to offset the costs of out of school enrichment and summer camps for low-income kids. I was running the Crocus Fund out of a checking account, and not a formalized 501-c3. Suzanne felt badly that the fund was ineligible to apply to the Green Foundation, so she sent me a (generous) check at the end of the year. She continued to do the same at the end of each following year, without my asking her to. She was the only person still supporting the Crocus Fund after I stopped actively fundraising for it. Over the course of six years we sent scores of local kids to summer camps who would otherwise not have attended and then collaborated with the Green Foundation to create an afterschool coming-of-age program at DuBois Middle School with Flying Deer Nature Center, which is still going strong today.

But I will always associate Suzanne with a happy scene of six- and seven-year-olds playing an impromptu soccer game at the end of another unorthodox school day, in the late fall of 2020. A few months earlier local families had learned that the school year would be starting out virtually, and working parents were scrambling to figure out how to prevent their children from spending seven hours alone at the kitchen table with a laptop. A group of nonprofit leaders—I was one of them—came together to create CLuB, a remote, outdoor education site located at Greenagers in South Egremont. In early September, we had the space, we had children signed up, and we had teachers, but we had no money.

Suzanne Green answered the call for support with an emergency \$50,000 grant from the Green Foundation, the second largest gift to the program in its eight months of existence. That gift inspired a wave of giving and enabled CLuB to serve 125 young students and their working parents for the eight months of remote school. Maria Rundle, the Executive Director of Flying Cloud Institute, who ran the day-to-day operations for CLuB, says of Suzanne, "She was the first person to support our coalition of service providers ... She was willing to walk the walk, and if all foundations had stewards like her this would be a better world."

Erik Bruun knows as much about the South County nonprofit scene as anyone. He's been on the board of Railroad Street since its inception, is the President of the Board of the Great Barrington Waldorf School, and recently joined the board of Community Health Programs. He noted that Suzanne will long be counted among those anonymous heroes "who end up as the financial foundation undergirding it all that we never see."
