

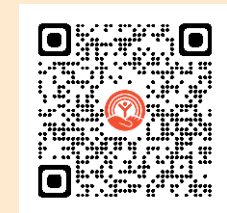


Help Berkshire County thrive

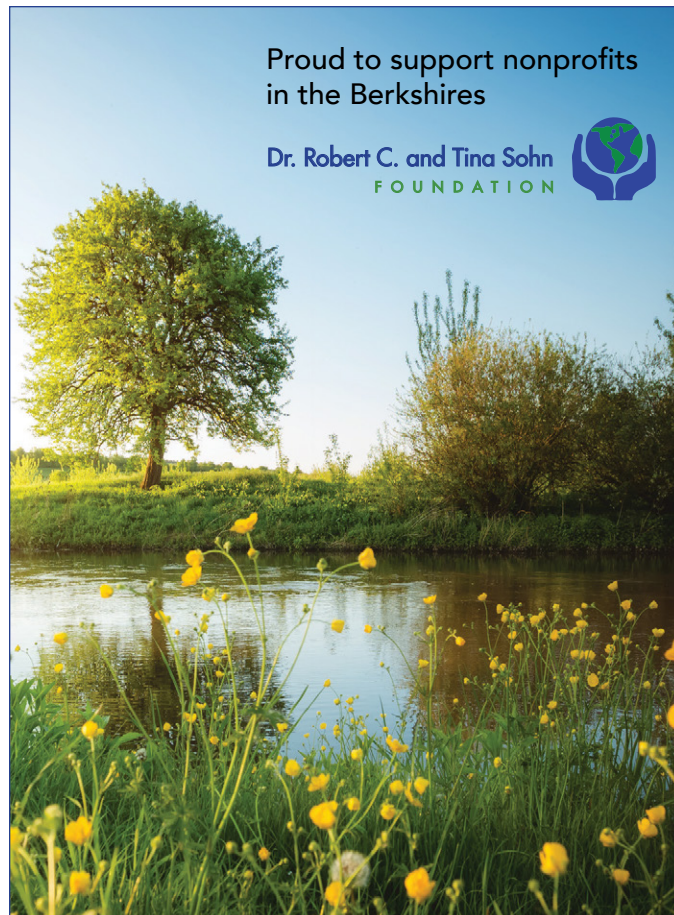

BASIC HUMAN RIGHTS; leveraging resources to feed our community

Like many Berkshire County transplants, I was drawn to this area for the picturesque views, the outdoor recreation, and the delicious farm-to-table cuisine. With a background in public health and nutrition education, through work, I was quickly introduced to the robust network of emergency food sites that are tirelessly addressing the "hidden" basic needs of this community; food security and a connection to resources. This network was a well-oiled machine, bringing in donated food, having ample volunteers, and effectively feeding the food-insecure community. The number of people accessing these sites stayed fairly steady, and needs were being met.

Thirteen years later, one pandemic, and a vastly different economic landscape, I have seen the community in need of food change drastically, and a spotlight has shone on the disproportionate access to resources across this county.

Food insecurity is at an all-time high across Berkshire County. The most recent data from 2022 shows that more than 14,000 people in Berkshire County are food insecure (FeedingAmerica.com). With rising food costs and the end of pandemic era benefits, families are faced with impossibly hard decisions. I have heard stories of Mothers skipping meals so their children can eat, Seniors missing meals in order to pay for medical bills, and families choosing between food and utilities. The emergency food site network including food pantries, meal sites, school district food distributions, and Senior Centers are serving hundreds more families than they were originally set up for. **Sites are reporting 10-15 new families each week, and food pantries have reported difficulty keeping their shelves stocked.** The projections and trends show us that this increased demand is expected to continue to grow.

Many emergency food sites have shifted the way they operate in order to meet the increased needs. Some food pantries have started to fundraise in order to buy additional food, some have hired paid staff to run the operation, some have initiated home delivery of food pantry boxes, and others have increased their distribution hours including adding a second day each week. All of these changes require additional capacity, more volunteers, and more food.

At Berkshire Bounty, we strive to build capacity in this network by increasing the quantity of food, close gaps by providing "last mile" logistics, and improving quality by focusing our efforts on nutritious food collection. Using over 100 registered volunteers, donated food is collected through a network of 27 retailers and delivered to 30 emergency food organizations that directly serve the community. In addition, Berkshire Bounty operates a Food Purchase Program. Through this program, we use a significant percentage of donated funds to purchase nutritious food including meat, dairy, eggs, fresh produce and culturally appropriate items to improve the quality of food choices in our partner distribution sites. My dedicated team works hard to match the increased needs of the community. In 2023, Berkshire Bounty collected 411,000 lbs. of nutritious food, the equivalent of over 342,000 meals for the local food-insecure community. During that period, Berkshire Bounty purchased a total of over \$350,000 worth of nutritious food which represented 70% of all expenses.

Berkshire Bounty is dedicated to being a valued partner to the food-insecure community. We believe that **access to nutritious food is a basic human right.**

By leveraging our community's existing resources we aim to achieve a significant impact. We value the expertise of the organizations we serve and regularly consult with them to make evidence-based decisions about our programs and services while making every effort to say "yes" to requests for assistance. By investing locally, we provide high-quality protein and fresh produce often missing in emergency food sites.



As executive director of Berkshire Bounty, I witness almost daily how the generous support and care of our community members provides nutritious food for our neighbors in need. If you are looking to donate food, money, or your time, every bit helps support community members in need enjoy this beautiful place where we work, live, and play.

This curriculum is based on the National Baseball Hall of Fame curriculum "Baseball in the Classroom" and is written to the Core Curriculum Standards. Our school programs are literature-based re-emphasizing the importance of reading.

MISSION

To further economic self-reliance in the region, BerkShares Inc. initiates, encourages, and administers educational and practical programs in the Berkshires — foremost, through issuance of our local currency.



PROGRAMS & OFFERINGS

BerkShares, our local currency for the region, functions to keep more money circulating locally, thus supporting a vibrant, sustainable local economy. There are currently over B\$140,000 in circulation, with 300 businesses participating in the program. BerkShares paper notes are available at six participating bank branches, with a 1:1 value fixed to the U.S. Dollar.

Beyond the currency project, BerkShares, Inc. envisions and strives to advance sustainable economic development via import replacing businesses. Basic human needs in the areas of food, shelter, energy, environment, employment, transportation, health care, education, cultural activities and social services could thus be increasingly met through collaborative local efforts.

During that period, Berkshire Bounty purchased a total of \$350,000 worth of nutritious food.
